Jeff Blosser, SCC committees, Event Services, and Sales shared updates, we saw a presentation about gender inclusivity, and participated in an inclusion activity before gathering on level 3 and the Garden Terrace for lunch.



Recap: Inclusivity Training

SCC is on a continuous journey to create an inclusive workplace where everyone feels valued and respected because of their differences. Our collective responsibility as employees is to embrace and demonstrate our commitment to diversity, inclusion, and belonging.

At the Summer All Staff, we learned the ABCs of gender, sexuality, and pronouns from River Teslar's *LGBTQ+ 101: Gender, Pronouns & What* presentation. She discussed the importance of navigating the world empathetically and taught us how understanding these diverse identities creates a safer and more welcoming work environment.

Many of you also had the opportunity to participate in our Web of Connectedness Activity where you courageously acknowledged and shared ways we are connected based on questions asked during the activity. As the ball of yarn was passed from person to person we could see intricate "webs" of connections being built with some team members you had never met before. We are all connected to each other, maybe in ways you did not expect! Building connections is a wonderful way to help our teams feel a sense of belonging and inclusion.

At the end of the activity, everyone was asked to make one commitment to a behavior or action that encourages an inclusive workplace where everyone feels a sense of belonging. We selected a few anonymous commitment examples for inspiration!

"Act as an ally even when it may seem uncomfortable due to peer pressure. Also, remember to present my own pronouns as an opening instead of asking for someone else's."

Let the games begin!

The Paris Olympics are in full swing. As the world comes together to compete in 40 different sports, take a moment to walk by the Jacob Lawrence mural titled *Games* on Arch Level 3.

Games was the first large-scale mural ever completed by Jacob Lawrence. It depicts a dense, rhythmic collage of athletes and cheering spectators in vivid colors and graphic forms that are hallmarks of the artist's paintings and prints. Lawrence is among the best-known 20th-century Black American painters and *Games* is considered one of the most historically significant artworks in the King County Public Art Collection.

Games consists of 10 enamel panels, which were made with the assistance of Dave Berfield, a highly skilled porcelain enamel fabricator who worked side by side with Lawrence to transfer his original drawing to metal. Powdered glass was poured into the outlined space of each individual color, then the panels were fired in a kiln where the heat fused the colored glass to the metal. The artwork was originally created for the Kingdome facility, but when the stadium was demolished in 2000, the mural was deinstalled and loaned to the Seattle Convention Center for public display.
