Art to look forward to

Though we've hosted events in Summit for two years it is not finished yet. With one of the final uses of the art budget we procured 16 additional works of art, all three-dimensional sculptures that will be presented in display cases. Here is a preview of the fun yet to come.

This Bald Eagle study by the artist Scott Fife is from a recent exhibition of his called Cardboard Kingdom. Fife is known for oversized portraits of humans and animals, whose character, according to the artist "animate our folktales and fill our collective imagination." Created in his Vashon Island studio, this bald eagle study was fabricated from cardboard pieces, cut and pieced together with drywall screws, glue, and pencil markings. The bird's appearance is based on careful studies of nature and photographs.

The artist's material use is surprising and his ability to manipulate the medium, which could have just been a cardboard box, into a life-like work is truly a marvel.
